Newspaper Polar Bear



Supplies in Bag

Newspaper, black paper, white paper, (2) google eyes, and blue background.

Home Supplies

Glue or tape, crayons/markers, and scissors.

Directions:

This activity is intended for you to do at home with your family.

1. Cut out several pieces from your newspaper to make your polar bear. Start with a large circle for the polar bear head and another half circle for the body. You will also need two ears and a circle or oval shape for the muzzle/mouth.
2. Cut out two half circles for the inner ears and a nose from black paper.
3. Tear a section of your white paper and glue to the back of your blue background. You will notice a section along the tear of the paper that gives great texture to your arctic craft.
4. Glue the polar body, cut from newspaper, at the bottom of your page and on top of the snow.
5. Glue the black nose inside the oval muzzle/mouth and the black inner ear pieces onto the ears. Glue the muzzle on the polar bear face and the ears at the top of the polar bear face.
6. Glue the polar bear face on top of the polar bear body and add the googly eyes.
7. Draw a mouth on your polar bear with your markers or crayons.
8. Use markers or crayons to create snowfall around your polar bear.
