Craft Packets can be picked-up at any branch within Brevard County and are available for curbside service.



### Jeweled Unicorn



#### Supplies in Bag

Crepe paper (single color, large), crepe paper (multiple colors, small), unicorn template, white paper.

#### Home Supplies

Glue and scissors.

#### **Directions:**

This activity is intended for you to do at home with your family.

- 1. Set aside the single color, large sheet of crepe paper. You will need it later.
- Get the smaller pieces of crepe paper and a pair of scissors. Cut them (or tear them if you prefer) into smaller shapes, about <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> X <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inch on a side. You can do diamonds or rectangles or circles. Choose a shape you enjoy.
- 3. Glue these shapes onto the body of the unicorn template.
- 4. Next, we are going to prepare the background. Take out the large sheet of crepe paper. Now crumple it up. Spread it back out and fold it over itself a couple of times to create a textured background. Glue this to the white paper. It's okay if it hangs over the edges.
- 5. Carefully cut out your unicorn. Glue it down upon your textured background.
- 6. Viola. You've created a jeweled unicorn. If you have left over crepe paper find other animal shapes to bejewel. You can try pokemon, other magical animals, or normal animals you would find in the wild.
