Animal Print Binoculars or Spyglass



Supplies Provided

Instructions & 3 sheets of animal-print paper to color

Home Supplies

Two toilet paper rolls or a paper towel roll cut into 2 equal sections. (Do not cut paper towel roll if you want to make the longer spyglass). Glue or glue stick, scissors, tape (any kind will do; you can find small rolls of fancy tape at the dollar store) and string (optional).

Directions:

This activity is intended for you to do at home with your family. Be careful with your scissors!

- 1. Color your animal print pages be creative!
- 2. Using glue or glue stick, cover your paper rolls with your colorful animal print. You may need to trim the ends to fit the rolls.
- 3. If making the binoculars, tape the rolls together, side by side.
- 4. If you want to add string, cut a length of about 24 inches. Punch a hole in each side of the binoculars, near the top, and thread an end of string through each hole. Tie each end of the string in a knot.

You can now wear your binoculars around your neck and go exploring! What do you see?
