In this week's Storytime Packet, our theme is the Barnyard! Join us down on the Farm to discover some suggested reads, rhymes, fingerplays, and crafts centered around life in the Barn, on a Farm.

All suggested reads can be found in the Brevard County Public Library System and are available to be checked out.

This packet consists of two fully developed storytimes: Babies & Toddlers, and Preschool. Each storytime can be used for all ages though and are for early literacy enrichment and education at home.

## Why storytime?

- Literacy development starts early in life and is highly correlated with school achievement.
- Reading and storytelling with your child promotes brain development and imagination, teaches your child about language and emotions, and strengthens your relationship.
- You don't always need to read books! Try looking at picture books, singing rhymes and songs, or telling stories from your culture.

(Quacking motion with fingers & thumb)

And all five ducks came waddling back!

(show 5 fingers on a hand)


## Lapsit Rhyme: "This Little Piggy" (image from English Songs & Rhymes)

And this little piggie cried 'wee, wee, wee!' all the way home.




## Farm Learning Activities:

#### Play with Farm Animal Toys.

Have fun making animal sounds while playing with stuffed animals, rubber ducks in the bathtub, and with images in books. This fun activity will teach your child the name of each animal and the sounds they make.

#### Learn about the Farm with Peter Rabbit.


B-I-N-G-O

Old MacDonald had a farm, E-I-E-I-O!


And on that farm, he had a pig, E-I-E-I-O!

## Pigs In A Blanket Food Craft

#### You will need:

- 1 tube refrigerated crescent rolls
- 1 12-ounce package cocktail wieners
- kosher salt for garnish

#### How-To:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.
- 2. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 3. Unroll the crescent rolls and cut each triangle of dough into three smaller triangles.
- 4. Place a wiener on top of the longer side of the dough. Gently roll toward the smaller side of the dough.
- 5. Once all the wieners are wrapped in dough, place them on the baking sheet.
- 6. Sprinkle each one with a bit of salt and bake them for 12-15 minutes or until they are golden-brown.
